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MAJOR CONTENT AREAS

- All students seeking Early Adolescence-Adolescence licensure are required to complete a major in a

 under Broad Field Social Studies include History, Political Science, Sociology, Economics, Psychology,
 DPI requires students to add a minor in History, Political Science, or Sociology with the Broad Field
 Social Studies Major.).
- All students seeking Early Childhood-Adolescence licensure are required to complete a major in a content area. Early Childhood-Adolescence content majors available: Visual Arts, Latin American Studies (Spanish), and Theater.
